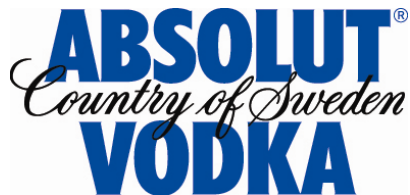

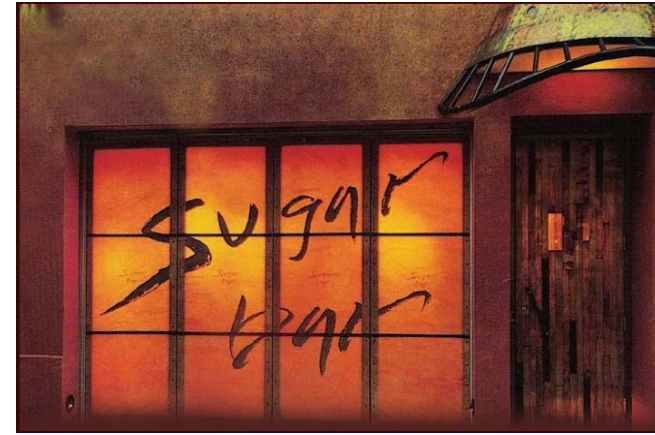

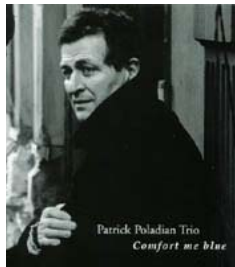
THE PERFORMERS

TSUNAMI 2004

On December 26, 2004 the Indian Ocean earthquake triggered a series of devastating tsunamis along the coasts that border the Indian Ocean. These tsunamis devastated the shores of Indonesia, Sri Lanka, India, Thailand and other countries with waves up to 30 meters.



According to the UN, reports state a loss of 229,866 people total with 189,983 dead and 42,833 missing. It has been reported by relief agencies that one third of the dead appear to be children. Measured in lives being lost, this catastrophe is one of the deadliest natural disaster in history.

The former UN Secretary-General Kofi Annan has stated that reconstruction would probably take between five to ten years. Governments and non-government organizations fear the final death toll may double as a result of diseases.

TSUNAMI HOSPITAL FOUNDATION

The Tsunami Hospital Foundation for Sri Lanka (THF) was founded in 2005 to build a world class hospital with a facility for caring for orphans in tsunami devastated Sri Lanka and the surrounding regions of South Asia and East Africa.

Our objective is to provide assistance to the people of Sri Lanka, primarily through the global private-sector corporate institutions. We plan to provide enhanced employment and skills advancement opportunities, particularly in the health care sector as well as further enhancing Sri Lanka's economic development and growth in the health care sector.

THF will fund a world class, privately run, nonprofit university-research hospital with two world class institutes:

- 1) Infectious Diseases Institute – for prevention and curative programs, and
- 2) Global Nutrition Center – to combat malnutrition/hunger. The facility will be dedicated to the 1.69 million people and 15 devastated countries of Southeast Asia and East Africa.

THF is in full support of UN Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) to reduce hunger/malnutrition by 2015.
